To know about working with individual young people

To be aware of the limitations of stereotyping

To understand the ways of challenging limiting beliefs and changing perceptions

To be aware of legislation regarding young people aged 16 and over

To understand the issues that arise from moving a child on

To know how to build resilience in children

To be aware of life story work and its relevance to the role of the learner
